I have a map of Winneconne that shows that Heinrich Marohn lived on the corner of Belle and Eugene Street in Winneconne. (This is also confirmed in a city directory just after 1900).

We have an article showing that Al Johnson was the bridge tender in 1918 - so Heinrich was the bridge tender in Winneconne before that time.

Obituary from Carl Umlandt - grandson of Heinrich Marohn

Heinrich Marohn died Sunday morning at 7:00 at his home in Winneconne of neuralgia. He was fifty-five years of age, was born in Germany and came to this country in 1882. He is survived by two daughters, Miss Alma Marohn of Winneconne and Mrs. Robert Umlandt of South Rapids, Minnesota and four sons, Emil, Henry, Karl (which is different than what my grandfather went by - he spelled it Carl, which I think was the English way vs German), and Frederick Marohn, all of Winneconne. Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at 1:45 o'clock at the residence and at 2:00 at the German Lutheran church, Rev. O. D. Hoyer officiating. Interment will be at the village cemetery.

Obituary translated from a local German language newspaper:

Heinrich Friedrich Wilhelm Marohn was born August 5, 1859 in Parpat, Germany, County Greifenberg, Pommern, Germany. He married Bertha Augusta Maria Ehlke in 1882. The same year he and his wife immigrated to the United States and settled in Ottawa, Illinois. (According to passenger listing, page 254 - they traveled on the ship Nuernberg from Bremen to Baltimore - arrived: April 30, 1882). In 1895 he moved with his family to (? - can't read), WI in the vicinity of NEILLSVILLE, WI. His wife died in 1896. Some years later he moved with his family to Winneconne. On June 19, 1905 his son, Herman died. He suffered years from rheumatism and later also had groth-Neuralgie. He died August 30, 1914, shortly after 7:00 in the morning at the age of 55 years and 25 days. Surviving are four sons, two daughters and two sisters in this country. September 1, 1914 was his funeral and internment at the town cemetery.

Obituary from Winneconne paper:

Mr. Henry Marohn was born August 5, 1859 in Parpat, Germany. In the year 1882 he was united in marriage with Miss Bertha Ehlke in Karnitz. Shortly after his marriage he came to America and settled in Ottawa, Illinois. Here he rented a farm for several years. Then, in 1895 he moved to Neillsville, Clark County with his family. Here he lived but a short time and then bought a farm eight miles from Neillsville. On his farm, however, he fought with adverse circumstances for the next year his wife died, 1896, and the following year his father. In 1898, he himself, was taken sick with rheumatism. As all things still went backwards, he sold his farm and moved to Winneconne. He, however, was never able to do hard work. For a few years he was janitor in the west side public school. A few years later he started a small book store in this village, but he was only able to keep it for a short time as he was taken sick with facial neuralgia. He was taken to Milwaukee and underwent an operation which proved successful but for a short time. For some months later he was compelled to go to bed. He never recovered since. He died August 30, shortly after seven o'clock. The cause of death was a chronic disease of long standing. The mourners are: Mrs. Robert Umlandt and Alma. Four sons Emil, Henry, Carl, and Frederick, two sisters, and many other relatives.

He was a farmer, but developed arthritis at an early age and was confined to a wheelchair when they moved to Winneconne from NEILLSVILLE, Wisconsin

Quote from Roselyn Prow's information:

September 7, 1895 Henry Marohn bought property in Clark County, Wisconsin, Township 23 North, Washburn Range 1, Section 19. The east one half of the west one half of section 19, township 23, North range 1, west of the 4th principle meridian containing 100 and 60 acres costing \$900.

In 1998 Robert and Jean Spiegelberg found the land that Heinrich owned. They also found the land that Ecker's and Mildebraths owned. Information following:

Heinrich Marohn owned approximately 80 acres in Sec. 19 of Washburn township (Clark County, WI). The property can be located by finding the area where Sherwood Road (running east and west) and Owen Road (running north and south) come together. Fred Ecker owned approximately 160 acres on the southeast side of that intersection - then Heinrich Marohn owned the next 80 acres laying north and south (NE 1/2 of the NW 1/4). Mildebrath's owned 240 acres (All of the S.E. 1/4 and 1/2 of the N.E. 1/4)

We went south on Owen Rd (Owen is the town line road between Washburn and Levi Townships). The end of the road dead ends at the Ulrich (in Levi township) farm (in plat noted as Hilda Ulrich Etal). We stopped to talk to Geo. Ulrich and his sister and they told us the following:

Ulrich's grandfather homesteaded the Ulrich farm

Marohn's attended a Lutheran church that was located on Owen Road. To find this go south on Owen Road to the Rock Creek bridge. The church was located 3/8 to 1/2 mile north of the creek, on the east side of the road. It is an open field (approx 40 acre field) with a high point of land in the center and it is now completely surrounded by trees.

The school they attended (South Washburn school - we have a picture of it) was sold in 1958 - it was also located on Owen Road, approx a 1/4 mile north of the bridge, between the bridge and the church on the same east side of the road. In 1998, according to George Ulrich, part of the foundation is still visible if you look for it.
